\*New boiler/new roof

\*Community Outreach through our Vegetable Garden Harvests, Blessings Box, Free Clothes Giveaway, Sewing Circle Baby Hats, Bibs, and Blankets, The OHat, Glove & SockÓ Giveaway to James R. Ludlow School in Philadelphia, Deacon's Thanksgiving Food Drive, Christmas Gift Drive for the Mother's Home in Darby, School Supply Collection/School Bag Project.

\*Special worship events/programs: Mission Service Sunday (Christmas Baskets), Christmas Music Worship, Christmas Eve Service, Thanksgiving Eve Service, Good Friday Service, Maunday Thursday Service, Easter Service, Memorial Day Service, Friendsgiving, Hanging of the Greens.

\*Christian Education programs: VBS, Kidstuff, Crew 123, Youth Group, Men's Bible Study, Sunday School.

\*Over the Hill Gang (OTHG)-met 52 times and completed dozens of projects. Two projects were dealing with the overgrowth of weeds on the lawn and replacing burnt fluorescent tubes with LED replacements.
