Running the Race Set Before Us



Philadelphia is famous for many good things: soft pretzels, water ice, pizza, cheesesteaks, hoagies just to name a few. It also has the reputation for being a "sports city" with loyal fans. One thing our city is known for is a special track and field event that occurs each Spring: The Penn Relays. University of Philadelphia hosts this event where the best high school and college track and field stars come to make a name for themselves. Wins at this event have helped make careers, And, of course, there are always many losers and questions, "what happened?" Indeed when things seem to be going well and then, we falter, it's a fair question, "what happened?"

That was exactly what the apostle Paul asked his Christian friends in the churches of Galatia. Using the idiom of the Greek athletic world in which Paul asks, "You were running well; who hindered you from obeying the truth?" The Galatians had faltered in their Christian living, They were not living the faith the

way he had taught them. Because he founded their churches, he knew them well. When he had left them to go in his missionary work, they were running the race that is the Christian life. Then, something happened. They faltered. They started lagging behind and falling out of the race. Why?! What happened?

Clearly, we are not the Galatians. While our situations are not exactly like theirs, many of us have faltered in this race that is our Christian life. We start out pretty well. We were excited to dedicate our lives to "living for Jesus!" We were faithful; we worshipped weekly; we read our Bible. But somewhere on this track called life, we ran into trouble. We tripped. We were edged off the track. We got discouraged. Do you feel that way?

Here are some encouraging words for you. The race is not over for us! It is a long run marathon. How can we win the race? Pick up your Bible. Read the Gospel of Mark or the 1st John letter everyday. Bring your thoughts back to prayer. Get back to Sunday worship. Join a small group at church-perhaps a Bible study, start attending Sunday School regularly. You'll be surprised how quickly you can get your "second wind." And soon, you will be able to say with the apostle Paul," ...forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 3:13-14)

Our Phillies are currently involved in a race for the pennant. It was Hall of Fame ballplayer, Yogi Berra, who said about a game of baseball, "It ain't over till it's over." Don't wait until it's too late to do what you should do! That was Paul's exhortation to the Corinthian Christians. He said," We urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain...See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation. (2nd Corinthians 6: 1-2). As we move into the Fall season, let us renew our commitment to Jesus Christ. Please prayerfully consider how God can use your time and talents to assist Holmes Church run the race!



I don't know exactly what the name proposal will be but, just keep a cool head and an open mind. Whether you like the changes or not God is guiding us. The changes might feel or sound weird but, in my experience, God knows what he is doing.
