A message from Elder Angelo LoCastro

"Noah"

Last month I was watching the science channel and they had a show about Noah's ark. A devout Christian was taking a group of engineers to an area in Turkey to study a boat shaped crater in an area about 30 miles from Mount

Ararat. The Turkish government has a visitor's center there because it is a very remote and desolate area. The center provided a cool environment, water and bathroom facilities, The Turkish government will not allow any digging at the site so these engineers were using ground penetrating radar to look for old timbers that would be used in the construction of the ark.

The crater is roughly the 300 by 50-cubit size that is mentioned in the bible so our Christian guide was very excited, thinking this could be the actual ark. The program gave the view of some geologists who believe that the boat shaped crater was a perfectly natural object created by an ancient mud flow.

The show bounces to various skeptics, scientists and historians who said the building of the ark is one enormous problem, but even if that massive construction project was possible how did he gather, and care for all those animals. Lions and deer don't exactly get along, so without divine intervention how was that possible. Just taking care of the dung would take an army, and feeding them for 110 days, holy cow.

At the end of the show the radar did show some promising signs of intersecting lines that could be timbers but the show ended there.

I was mildly disappointed at the ending, but if someone had found absolute proof of the ark it probably would be all over the internet and I didn't see that, so my disappointment didn't last long.

I admit I didn't give Noah and his voyage very much thought throughout my life. The last time I even used his name was when my son was small and my wife and I bought him a bathtub playset that included Noah, his wife who I jokingly called Yesah, his family, an assortment of animals, and of course the ark.

For some reason the story of Noah has been in my mind; I reflected about it and to me it doesn't matter if it is just a story or it actually happened; it is the lesson that is important. Noah was faithful to God and was a good person, God gave him guidance to save himself and his family. A devastating flood took away the world and God protected him, gave him the tools he needed and a chance to restart. This happens to human beings all the time, Floods, fire, sickness, destruction, death. This story is relevant to our lives today.

Looking back, my wife and I have had metaphorical floods happen to us over the years with health and job issues. We have been faithful to God and he gave us the tools to restart. I am very thankful to God for His guidance and assistance.

This story can relate to all of us in many situations. What we are going through at Holmes church is another example: The flood was the division in our membership concerning the change in leadership. This takes some time to find a new beginning for us. We are now seeing the waters recede and we are heading for land, a new start, like Noah.

JULY-Something is taking shapebut we're not telling til it's ready!


