The Reason for Easter

Youth Group kids, in years past, have often asked Mark and me what is the most important Christian holiday to us? Of course, they expect us to answer "Christmas", and they are a little puzzled that we both solidly answer "Easter." And while we absolutely love Christmas, Easter hands down is the most important holy day for Christians. Yes, we celebrate the birth of our Savior at Christmas, and His birth is necessary for Easter to happen, but belief in Jesus' birth alone is not what is required to receive the gift of eternal life.

When I was 15, I went on a Winter Youth Retreat with the Holmes Youth Group. On a Saturday night, the speaker was reading in detail from the Bible what Jesus went through from the Last Supper, through the horrors of His betrayal and crucifixion, to His glorious resurrection on Easter. After he was done with the lesson, the speaker let us go outside and gave us time to think about what Jesus did for us with his death on the cross and overcoming death with His resurrection. I was so emotionally overcome, (as I was outside looking at God's winter wonderland and looking at the star-filled sky) that I fell to my knees and cried when it really hit home that Jesus died on the cross for a sinner such as me! How could I be worthy of such love? And Jesus didn't just die for me, He did it for you and all of humanity! Jesus not only forgave my sins, but the world's sin, so we can have everlasting life. Jesus had the power to save Himself, but that wasn't God's will. God sent His beloved Son to take away the sins of the world. John 3:16 states, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whosoever believes in Him, shall not perish, but have everlasting life!" It was there at that camp, that I committed my life to Christ.

As miraculous as Jesus' birth is, Jesus' death and resurrection are the single most important combination of events that gives us the promise of spending eternity with our Heavenly Father.

As Holy Week approaches, I pray that all of us take time to reflect not only on the somber events that led to Jesus' death on the cross, but also the glorious day of Easter where we celebrate the resurrection of our Savior and Lord!
