#### **World Communion**

This coming Sunday, October 5th, congregations around the globe will celebrate World Communion Sunday. Most of us have

heard about World Communion Sunday but may not know much about where the celebration originated. According to the website of the National Council of Churches, World Communion Sunday began in 1936 in the Presbyterian Church and was adopted by the Federal Council of Churches (predecessor of the NCC) in 1940. Since then, the celebration has grown into an international ecumenical celebration of Christian unity. The key word for World Communion Sunday is communion, or unity. It is a day when we mark the almost universal Christian practice of breaking bread with one another and remembering both the night of Jesus' betrayal—when Jesus instituted what we now call the Lord's Supper as a lasting remembrance—and of Jesus' sacrifice. World Communion Sunday is on the Christian calendar for a reason: it can and should be a time of profound Christian unity, marked by our shared celebration of the Lord's Supper. Jesus instituted the first such meal, and World Communion Sunday is a helpful way in which Christ calls us back together to celebrate the liturgy "in remembrance of me."

#### Why do Bad Things Happen to Good People?

Mark and I were talking to our Youth during our Youth Meeting tonight. One of the youth remarked that September was a bad month with all the bad things that made the headlines in the news and they were feeling a little overwhelmed. This diverted our original Bible discussion and we started talking about "Why do Bad Things Happen to Good People?" which coincidentally is what Pastor Carpenter preached about today in church. So why do bad things happen to Christians?

We live in a world of pain and suffering. There is no one who is not affected by the harsh realities of life, and the question "why do bad things happen to good people?" is one of the most difficult questions in all of theology. God is sovereign, so all that happens must have at least been allowed by Him, if not directly caused by Him. At the outset, we must acknowledge that human beings, who are not eternal, infinite, or omniscient, cannot expect to fully understand God's purposes and ways.

I found this excellent and helpful article on Why Do Bad Things Happen to Good People on Got Questions Ministry which I would like to share with you.

The book of Job deals with the issue of why God allows bad things to happen to good people. Job was a righteous man (Job 1:1), yet he suffered in ways that are almost beyond belief. God allowed Satan to do everything he wanted to Job except kill him, and Satan did his worst. What was Job's reaction? "Though he slay me, yet will I hope in him" (Job 13:15). "The LORD gave and the LORD has taken away; may the name of the LORD be praised" (Job 1:21). Job did not understand why God had allowed the things He did, but he knew God was good and therefore continued to trust in Him. Ultimately, that should be our reaction as well.

Why do bad things happen to good people? As hard as it is to acknowledge, we must remember that there are no "good" people, in the absolute sense of the word. All of us are tainted by and infected with sin (Ecclesiastes 7-20; Romans 3:23; 1 John 1:8). As Jesus said, "No one is good—except God alone" (Luke 18:19). All of us feel the effects of sin in one way or another. Sometimes it's our own personal sin; other times, it's the sins of others. We live in a fallen world, and we experience the effects of the fall. One of those effects is injustice and seemingly senseless suffering.

When wondering why God would allow bad things to happen to good people, it's also good to consider these four things about the bad things that happen:

- 1) Bad things may happen to good people in this world, but this world is not the end. Christians have an eternal perspective: "We do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal" (2 Corinthians 4: 16-18). We will have a reward some day, and it will be glorious.
- 2) Bad things happen to good people, but God uses those bad things for an ultimate, lasting good. "We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28). When Joseph, innocent of wrongdoing, finally came through his horrific sufferings, he was able to see God's good plan in it all (Genesis 50: 19-21).

#### Using Our Time, Talents, and Finances



Sunday, September 21, Pastor Bill's sermon was on using our spiritual gifts. 1Peter 4:10 says "Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms." God has blessed us all in many ways and has enabled us to obtain all that we have. However, these blessings and talents that the Lord has given us are

not free. God expects to use them for the good of His kingdom. Ways we can do this brings to mind two annual events that are coming up; our Stewardship Campaign and the Nominating Committee.

The Stewardship Campaign asks us to give back to God a portion of what he has given us. The Old Testament expected people to tithe (give 10%) of the first fruits. This was given so that the people could remember that everything comes from the Lord and that we are to be thankful for what He has given us. This tithe was used to provide for the Levite priests. With the New Testament and the coming of Christ, we do not fall under the Levitical Law. 2 Corinthians 9:7 says "Let each one do just as he has resolved in his heart, not grudgingly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." Hebrews 13: says "Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have because God has said I will never leave you: never will I forsake you." Over the past few years, only 52% of the members and friends of Holmes Church have been willing to return the pledge slips they received and put their commitment (pledge) to God in writing. We are asking this year that each of you look at all God has blessed you with over the years and return the pledge slip you receive with your written commitment to return to God a portion of what He has given you, so His work can be continued through His vessel, Holmes Church. The Lord has graciously given us what finances we have, and we should use them for His glory. Let us honor Him in how we spend each dime and give back to Him what is already His.

The second event is the Nominating Committee. Each year this committee meets to seek members to serve God in certain capacities such as Elders, Deacons and Trustees. This is another way we can use the gifts God has given us for His good. The Bible says everyone is called to serve God by serving others. Galatians 5:13 says "You my brothers were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather serve one another in love." We are not saved by serving, but are saved for serving. We are hoping, that if you are asked to serve, you search your heart and prayerfully ask for God's guidance in making your decision.



- 3) Bad things happen to good people, but those bad things equip believers for deeper ministry. "Praise be to . . . the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. For just as we share abundantly in the sufferings of Christ, so also our comfort abounds through Christ" (2 Corinthians 1: 3-5). Those with battle scars can better help those going through battles.
- 4) Bad things happen to good people, and the worst things happened to the best Person. Jesus was the only truly Righteous One, yet He suffered more than we can imagine. We follow in His footsteps: "If you suffer for doing good and you endure it, this is commendable before God. To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps. 'He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth.' When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly" (1 Peter 2: 20-23). Jesus is no stranger to our pain.


Roans 5:8 declares, "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Despite the sinful nature of the people of this world, God still loves us. Jesus loved us enough to die to take the penalty for our sins (Romans 6:23). If we receive Jesus Christ as Savior (John 3:16; Romans 10: 9), we will be forgiven and promised an eternal home in heaven (Romans 8:1).

God allows things to happen for a reason. Whether or not we understand His reasons, we must remember that God is good, just, loving, and merciful (Psalm 1345: 3). Often, bad things happen to us that we simply cannot understand. Instead of doubting God's goodness, our reaction should be to trust Him. "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight" (Proverbs 3: 5-6). We walk by faith, not by sight.
